



Grade 2 Newsletter

We will cover two topics in **Math**: data and measurement. We will start by creating tally charts and later on children will be able to read, analyze and set up picture graphs and bar graphs on their own. After our data unit, we will move on to measurement; students will learn how to use metric units (meter, centimeter) how to measure objects using a centimeter ruler. Children will understand the conversion between metric units and they will be able to estimate, compare and find the difference between the lengths of two objects.

In **Social Studies**, students will learn about the difference between needs and wants. They will also gain knowledge on who producers and consumers are and the different ways in which people earn money.



In **Science**, Grade 2 will be reviewing land forms such as mountains, lakes, rivers, valleys and oceans. Students will then learn more about how landforms and fossils are created through natural disasters.

In **English Language Arts**, we will finish our story called Chinatown.

Students will read the story, and answer comprehension questions about it. They will also learn how to summarize a story, by telling the most important parts of the story. In grammar, they will learn about common nouns, exact nouns and word endings such as -er and -est.
